- B) Business - working in a public or private store, business or industry; keeping books, managing people and merchandise.

YOUR TOP INTEREST CLUSTERS

Service - Fire Science

Workers in this group control and extinguish fires, protect life and property, and maintain equipment as a volunteer or employee of a city, township, or industrial plant. Workers could travel to other areas and fight forest or very large fires. They respond to fire alarms and other emergency calls. Select hose nozzle, depending on the type of fire, and direct streams of water or chemicals onto fire. Position and climb ladders to gain access to upper levels of buildings or to assist individuals from burning structures. Create openings in buildings for ventilation or entrance, using ax, chisel, crowbar, electric saw, core cutter, and other power equipment. Other workers in this group inspect fire damage, investigate fires for arson or other causes. Still others provide service to prevent fires and accidents by informing businesses, schools and individuals on safety. Other workers in this group are involved in hazard waste, chemical waste, and environmental protection caused by some emergency.

Service-Barbering/Cosmetology

Workers in this group provide people with a variety of barbering and beauty services. These services involve care of the hair, skin, and nails. These workers find employment in barber and beauty shops, department stores, hotels and retirement homes. A few workers find jobs on passenger ships. Some are self-employed and work in their own homes or go to the customer.

Food Services

Workers in this group manage restaurants of other eating establishments. Workers perform a wide variety of tasks from food preparation, food storage to serving food and properly cleaning afterwards. Duties involve, management, buying and pricing of food, balancing food nutrition, cooking, cutting and preparing a variety of food items. Work could be performed in restaurants, hospitals, schools, penal institutions, and in private homes for thousands of people at a large banquet or for one special client.
