You are outwardly centered, which means you are keenly aware of what is going on around you and what is happening to others. You like being with people and people like being around you.

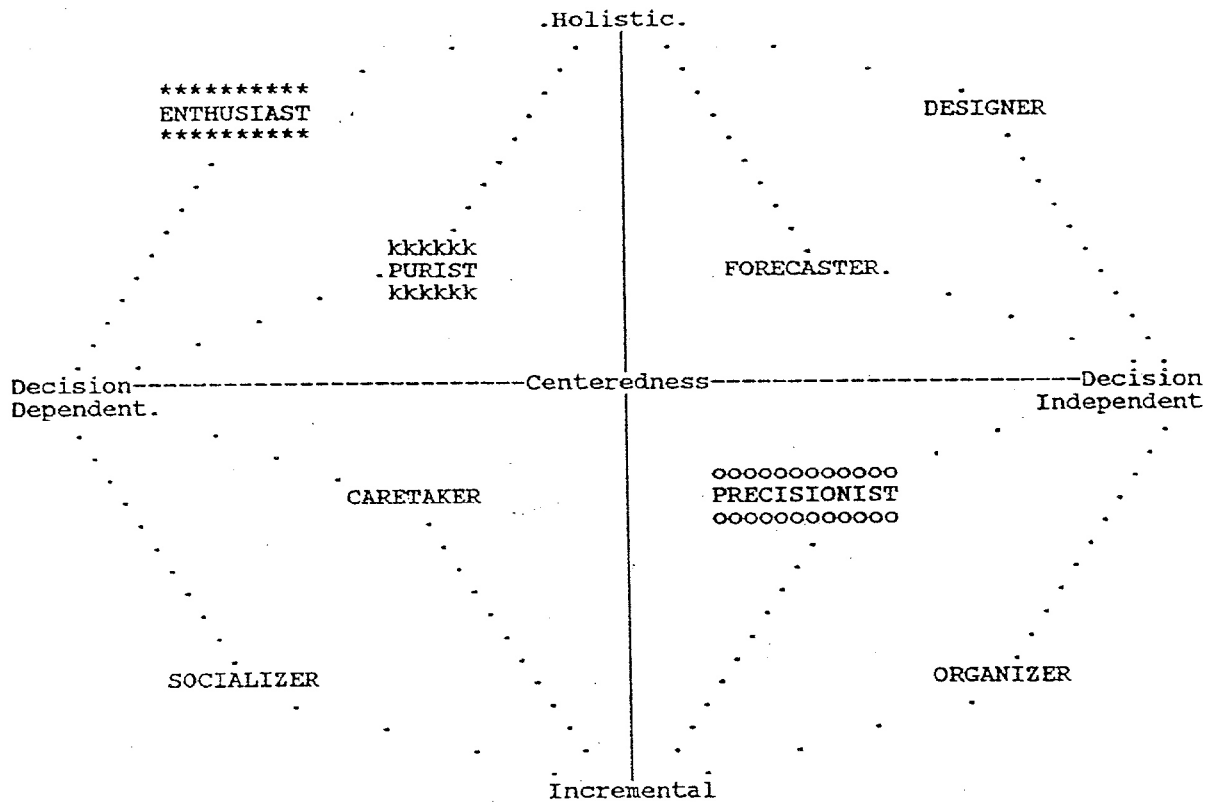
